


# Daisetsu Mori-no Garden Map

## Beautiful wildflowers bloom from season to season inside Taisetsu-no-Mori Gardens

Two different gardens: the tranquil healing powers of trees and wildflowers of the Mori-no-Geihinkan and colorful Mori-no-Hanazono, are both built on Asahigaoka, Taisetsu highlands, the most beautiful hills of the Taisetsu Mountain Range.

## Forest Flower Garden

Mori-no Hanazono

Garden Design: Sayuki Ueno (Ueno Farm)

### 1 Daisetsu Garden

Created with the intention of valuing all of the flora present in the Daisetsu Mountain Range, this garden showcases a variety of alpine plants and species native to Hokkaido. Tourists and locals alike can delight in the local foliage.



### 2 Seasonal Habitats

Flowers with similar blooming seasons are arranged together, so that they may compete in their blossoming and delight visitors with completely different scenery each season.



### 3 Flower Fountain

A garden which depicts a fountain welling up from the surface using earthly ground cover plants, whose leaves and flowers seem to crawl along the ground as they grow. Ajuga, thyme, Lysimachia and other flowers spread like a carpet as pole-shaped flowers show us their bulbs.



### 4 Familiarity Garden

This garden was designed for those who love flowers and want to fully enjoy them: to touch them, smell them—experience them with all of their senses. You can find many unique flowers here with unusual colors, scents, shapes and textures.



### 5 Kamui Mintara

Many types of flora such as large Persicaria and Filipendula rubra, with gently swaying grasses and herbs combine to create dynamic movement. This is the largest space of the five theme gardens, and these specimens represent a carefree "garden where the gods play." Very Hokkaido.



## Forest Guesthouse

Garden Design: Kozaburo Ryu (Ryokka Keikaku)

### 6 Forest Gateway

The Forest Gateway welcomes you into the Guesthouse. With each step forward, you will witness the transformation from a colorful, lush garden to a deep green forest.



### 7 Forest Carpet

This space is embraced by a natural atmosphere completed using pre-existing, native flora to represent the grasslands of the Daisetsuzan. Astilbe and other refreshing flowers are also effectively arranged.



### 8 Forest Living Room

Organized as a place to relax and enjoy oneself for a short time, alongside the pizza oven-equipped "Forest Dining/Kitchen" and "Forest Bar" facilities. Enjoy this area as you would your own living room.



### 9 Soothing Valley

Bask in the comforting view of the expanding countryside in the distance, atop this shaded terrace which ripples like a traditional Japanese mortar. Also be sure to enjoy the nearby water-loving plants such as Caltha palustris var. barthei, Primula sieboldii, and Lobelia sessiliflora.



### 10

A garden of samples from around 70 collected species native to Hokkaido. See plants that have been useful for living since days past. Smell the trees, hear the rustling of the wind, and enjoy the expansive scenery that emphasizes the characteristics of each plant. An outdoor museum where you can learn with your senses.




Daisetsu Mori no Garden overall layout: Takano Landscape Planning


